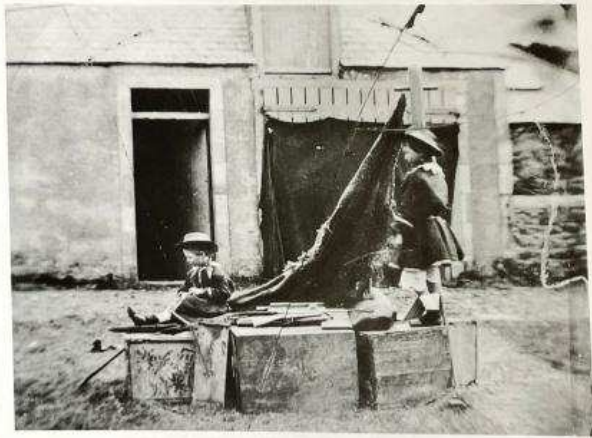

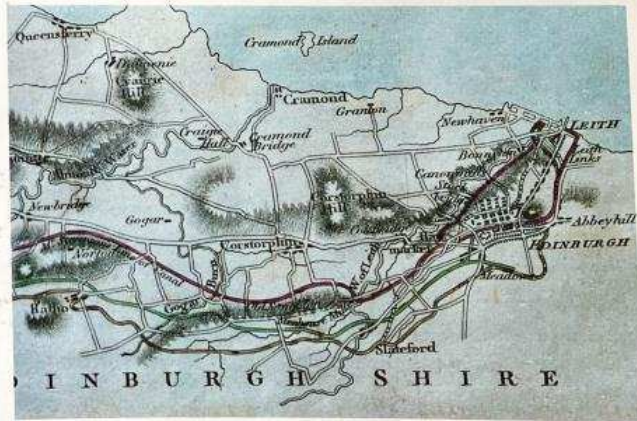

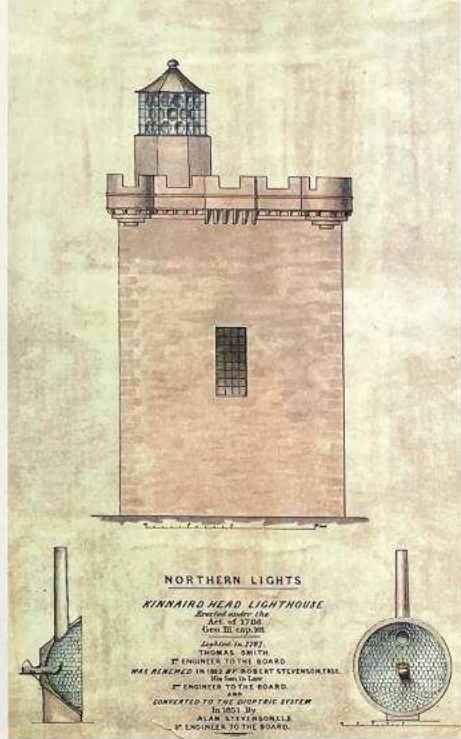


[18] Old drawing of the Bell Rock Lighthouse kitchen as formerly decorated for visitor and library use.

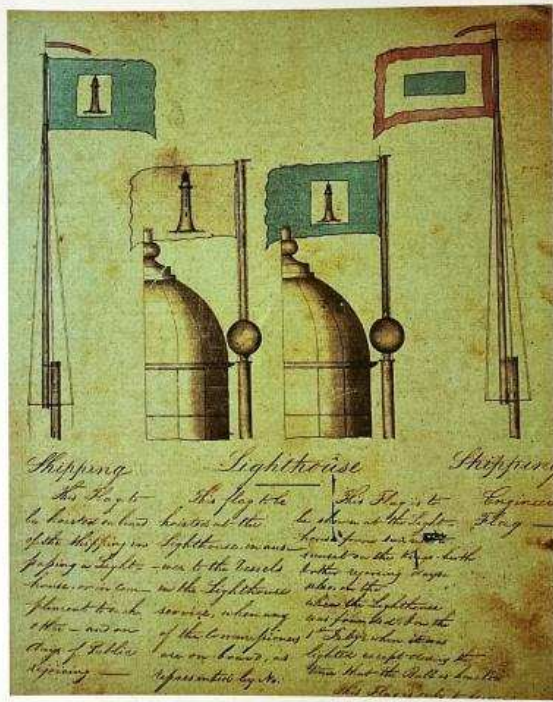

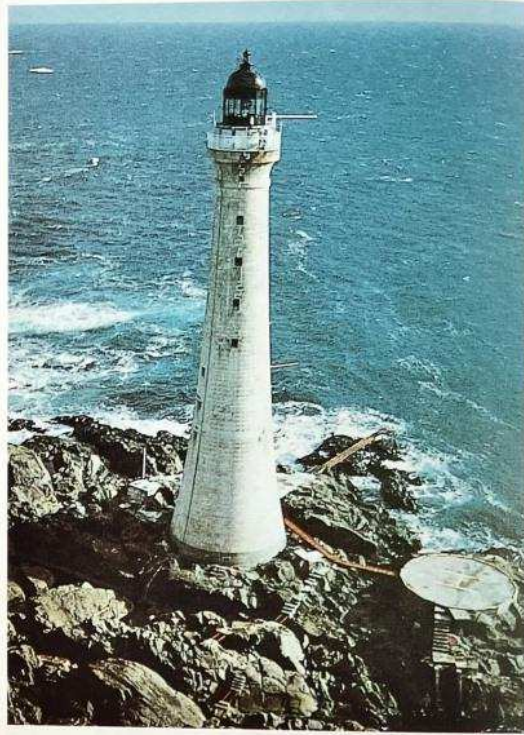

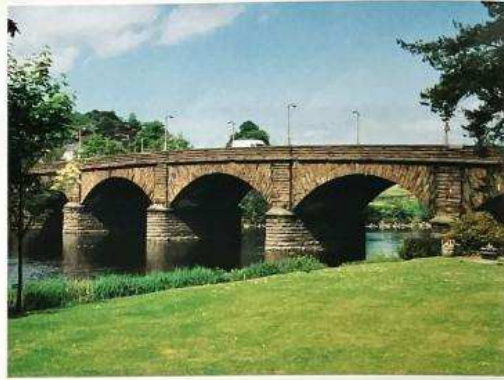

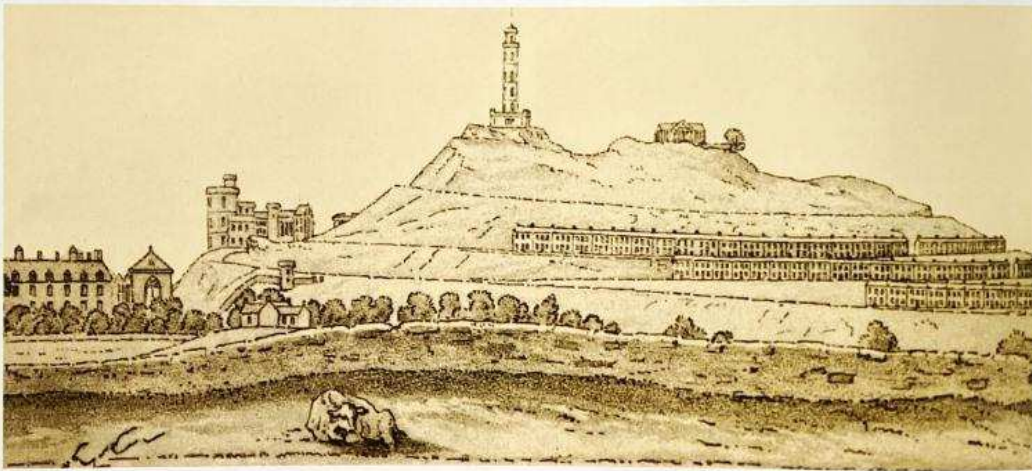




[30] *Temporary bridge over r. Clyde at Portland Street, Glasgow, 1832-46.*



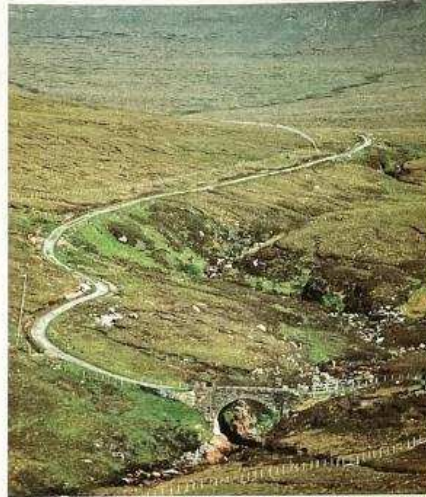
[31] *William IV, or New Bridge, over r. Forth, Stirling, 1829-32.*

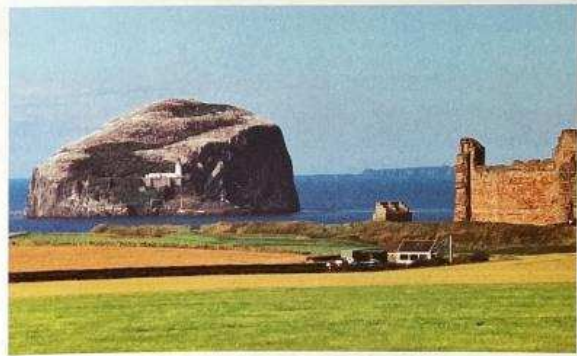

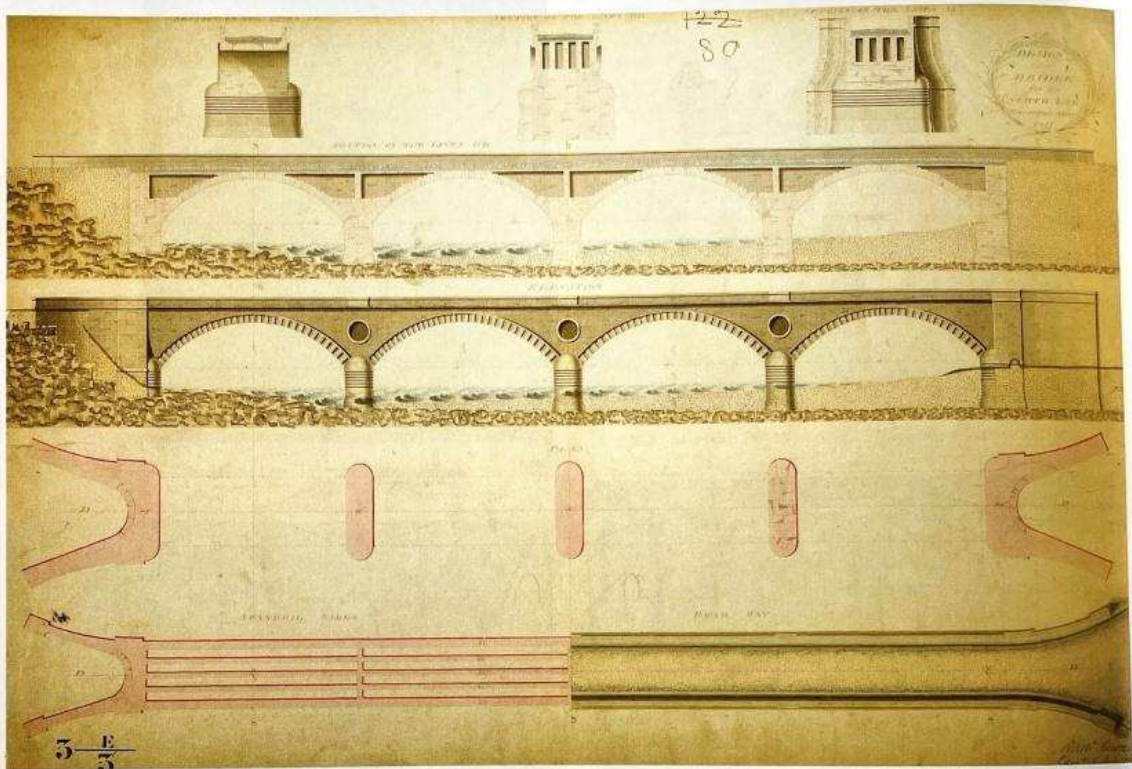


[95] Mull of Kintyre Lighthouse, 1822. Plaque for lighting apparatus, 1906.

[35] Marykirk Bridge, Kincardineshire, 1811. Robert's first major bridge. Note his use of hollow spandrels for lightness and strength.

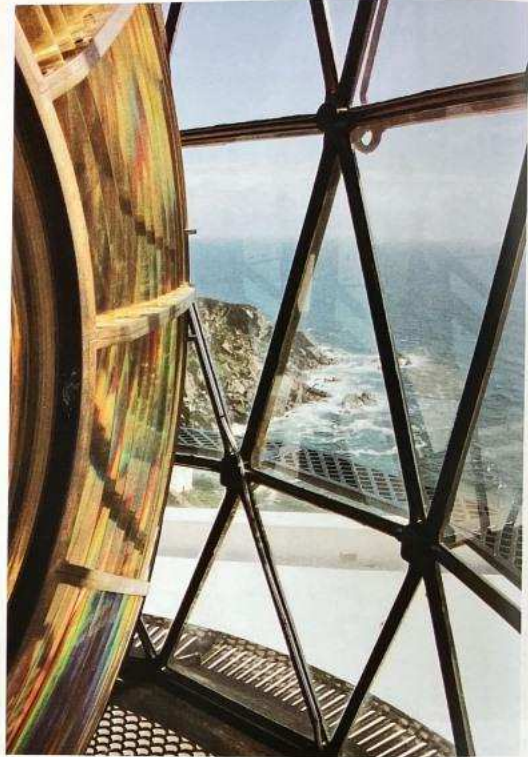

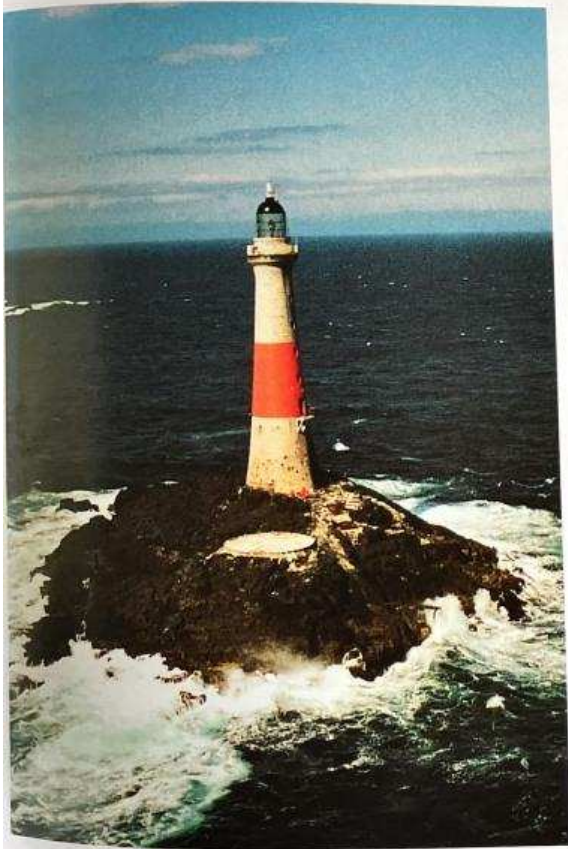




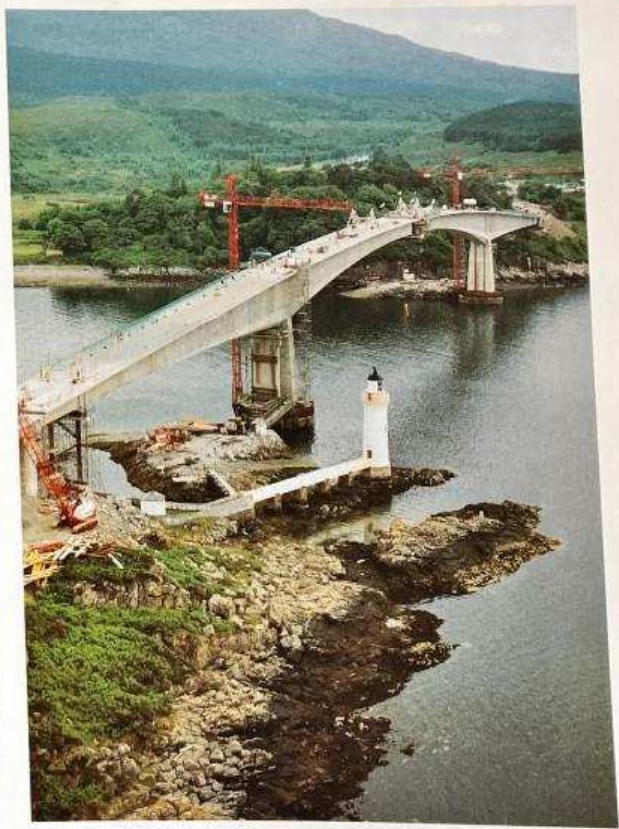

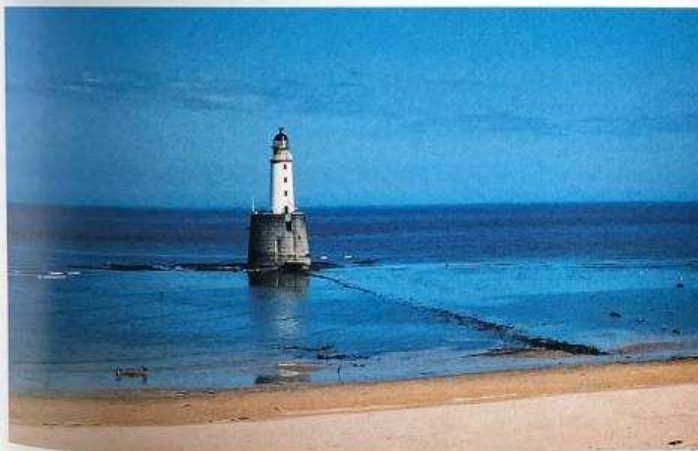

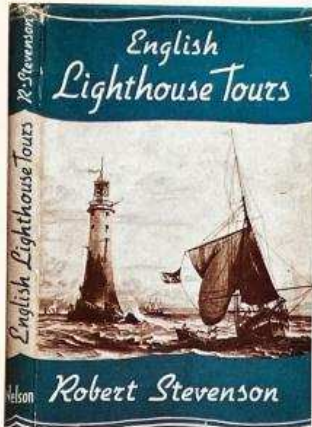

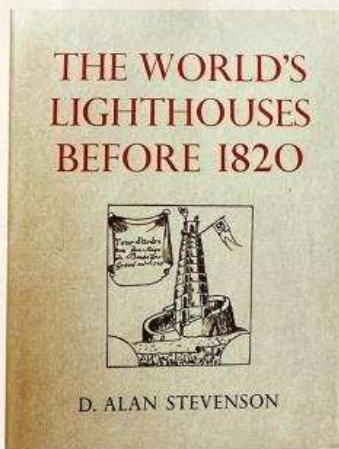

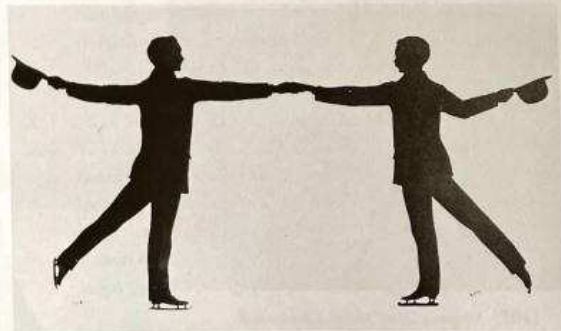
