Panel for Historical Engineering Works PHEW

The panel continues to raise the profile of the contribution of civil engineers through recording and promoting civil engineering landmarks. This year's highlights include:

- New plaques:
 - **The Titan Crane**, the world's first giant electrically-powered cantilever crane, was designated as an International Historic Civil Engineering Landmark by the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). Their president was joined by ICE, ASME and IMechE Presidents at the unveiling and civic dinner in Clydebank. Considerable media interest has resulted in increased patronage at the visitor centre.
 - **The Bell Rock Lighthouse** was designated a National Historic Engineering Landmark
 - **The Caledonian and Göta Ship Canals** unveiled by the Chairman at Motala, Sweden

- Summer Tour of Border Railway structures including the threatened Union Chain Bridge [1820] near Berwick, Kielder Reservoir and Borders landmarks, all based on a congenial stay at the historic concrete Waverley Castle Hotel, Melrose resulting in coverage on Good Morning Scotland
